### Paulerspury War Memorial

Thanks to grants received from County Councillor Mr Walker via his Councillors' Empowerment Grant Scheme (£500), South Northamptonshire Council Community Development Capital Grant Scheme (£650) and the War Memorials Trust (£1,000) the base of the Paulerspury War Memorial has been repaired. Mr Trevor Dean was the stonemason who undertook the work. The new stone is from Great Tew. The original stone was from Hornton, but this source has been exhausted. The late Mr Bill Lepper's father built the War Memorial which was handed over to the Parish Council in 1926. The total cost of the Memorial which was commissioned by Mrs Ella Harrison was £200. Sadly there is no record of who carved the Calvary.
