From the Vicarage Desk

We have celebrated Christmas, marked the turn of the year, begun the year of our Lord, 2017! Before I continue on, I would like to take this opportunity to offer my thanks and appreciation for all the hard work, effort and support that makes the celebration of Christmas possible in our group of five parishes, five parish churches and for our communities.

As I write this I have not yet had the first of the Beer and Carols but I have already been asked about the possibility of adding an extra one of these for Christmas 2017, at Whittlebury!

I hope that everyone has been able to stay healthy and happy through this wonderful festive season. Of course, we are now into the year and we need to consider what we are going to with our lives and how we are going to make the most of the opportunity that we have. As those who believe in God, who follow the Way of the Lord, I believe that we have a great opportunity to bring light and hope to the world, in which we live because this is the message from Jesus.

Many of you will know that I regularly refer to particular passages of Scripture, my personal inspiration texts. One of these is this:

Matthew 28. 18 - end

And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

In these words of Jesus we have clear instruction to go out, to share Good News with the world, with all amongst whom we live and all whom we may meet. Having had the time through this past Christmas I was left thinking that a part of what this means today, for us, is that we need to be involved in advertising. This is one form of Evangelism, to share the Good News and invite people to hear the Word of God and so to make a commitment in their lives to following Jesus.

Yes, to ensure that this Good News is heard by as many people as possible we need to ensure that we are advertising the services, the opportunities to hear and to participate in the wonder of this Good News. We had the Crib scene on the end of St Michael's Church; we used advertising for our Carol Services and had the added help of the Children's Society to advertise the Christingle Services. There has been a website organised by the Church of England online from November which had the details of our Christmas Services shown for the world to see. [www.achristmasnearyou.org]

Well, later this year, between Ascension and Pentecost, we are going to do a little bit across our Parishes to engage in a prayer outreach time that has been called, 'Thy Kingdom Come'. We have not firmed up what we shall do, however, we are hoping that we can make a difference by engaging in Prayer and Witness. Please keep a looking out for more information about this, the dates, for your diaries now, 25th May to 4th June 2017.

Again, reflecting on aspects of Christmas in 2015 and hoping (as I write this) that 2016's Beer & Carols goes as well, I am led to wonder on how we, as the Churches in these villages and communities might do more for 'outreach'? That is to be overtly being Christian in the world beyond the doors of the Church.

This is indeed a part of the work I have the privilege of engaging in at Silverstone Circuit and which I try to do by many engagements with people in our communities who do not come to church. However, there must be more that we can do, I know it to be so for this is God's work and mission.

Jesus spent time in the Synagogues, in the place where religious people gathered, but he spent much more time outside of these places, speaking with people in the market places, in their homes, on the streets. How can we do the same in our culture amongst our neighbours and for our communities?

Just as with the planning for our engagement in 'Thy Kingdom Come', where I do not have the ideas, but the enthusiasm to see something happen, so it is with our Outreach. I firmly believe that to be churches that are able to grow, we must be able to look beyond our gathered communities in Church and see how we can make a difference with and amongst the people who do not come into the buildings that we call church.

A budding idea is that we could have an outreach team, work group, task force or whatever name might be used. And so, as we are looking towards the beginning of this New Year I ask you to pray about this. How can we engage further in Outreach? Who might be those who are called by God, who can be equipped by the Church and empowered then to work alongside me to engage in the work and mission of bringing Good News to the nations, beginning in our part of this nation?

The wonder is that God wants the church, the gathered people of His family, to grow both in the depths of faith and also, wonderfully, in the numbers of those who gather. Not only does God want this, but God will also empower this with the Grace of forgiveness, love and the presence of The Holy Spirit.

Let us be people of faith and hope into 2017.

St John the Baptist Church, Abthorpe

A Happy New Year to everyone from us all at St John the Baptist Church. As I write, we have just finished decorating the church for Christmas and the food box with the Christmas donations has been taken to the food bank. We look forward to our Christmas services and celebrations and hope that the year ahead is a calm and peaceful year.

Food Bank The box that was recently taken to the Food Bank weighed 24.3kg, making the total since we first put the box in church 946.8kg. Thank you to the people of Abthorpe who continue to give to this and to John and Joyce Riches for ensuring that the box is emptied regularly.

We have just sent the cheques off to our chosen charities for 2016 from our Giving Fund. These are the local branch of MIND; Embrace the Middle East (supplying Winter Survival Kits for refugees) and Tearfund's appeal for the Yemen Crisis.
