124/09/18 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND PRESS

Comments are welcome from those attending the meeting. The total time allowed for this item is 15 minutes with a maximum of 3 minutes per speaker. Further public comment during the meeting is permissible only at the invitation of the Chairman.

Three members of the public were present including County Councillor Mr Walker and District Councillor Mrs Barnes.

Mr Walker said that there was a Stabilisation Plan (measures to balance Northamptonshire County Council's budget in 2018/19 and financial implications of those measures for future years) being put in front of the Commissioners appointed to oversee the transformation of the eight councils into two Unitary Authorities. The embargo on the Stabilisation Plan would be lifted on the 1st October.

Mrs Barnes said that the South Northamptonshire Settlements and Countryside Local Plan (Part 2) Proposed Submission Local Plan (Regulation 19) formal representation period would run from Thursday 4 October until noon Friday 16 November 2018 with the aim of presenting it to the Inspectors in January 2019.

Reduction of 2 metres all round of Sycamore Tree

The tree was fully mature and was in a prominent position within the surrounding area and visible from various surrounding publicly accessible points giving a high amenity value.

The tree was in a good physiological condition as far as one could see with a good structural form and no apparent defects. It was the largest tree in the surrounding area and unique in the village given its shape and size.

It did not have a particularly dense canopy of leaves therefore the reduction in light on the property in the main only occurred when the sun was temporarily directly behind the tree.

It was the opinion of the Parish Council that to reduce the tree by 2 metres all round would have a significant detrimental effect on the impact on the character of the tree. The Parish Council therefore OBJECTS to this application.

 - Pot holes outside Highfields, Cuttle Mill Lane re-reported (missed when others were filled)
 - Fly tipping enquiry Tews End Lane still ongoing
 - No action yet regarding the damaged Plumpton End bridge
 - The 4 salt bins the Parish Council wished to take ownership of would be covered under our current insurance policy.
 - Pot hole repairs had been carried out in Plum Park Lane and several other places around the village appears to be a more robust material.
 - The exposed rusty edges of the window frames of the telephone box situated on the High Street could pose a risk to members of the public. The Council therefore resolved to explore solutions to complete this project.
