#### 60/05/19 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND PRESS

Comments are welcome from those attending the meeting. The total time allowed for this item is 15 minutes with a maximum of 3 minutes per speaker. Further public comment during the meeting is permissible only at the invitation of the Chairman.

Six members of the public were present including District Councillor Mrs Barnes. Mrs Barnes informed the meeting that the new authority would be fully operational from 1 April 2021. Town, Parish and Shadow Unitary Council elections to take place in May 2020. There would be 93 councillors in the new unitary authority.

#### 61/05/19 PLANNING MATTERS

a) <u>S/2019/0931/FUL</u> Mr Gary Humphreys. Willow Bank, Plumpton End, Paulerspury.

Demolition of Existing Workshop, Extension to existing House and Construction of new Pool House and Garage Block.

Paulerspury Parish Council had **NO OBJECTIONS** to this application.

## b) <u>S/2019/0869/FUL, 0870/LBC</u> Mr Anthony Carse. Old Smithy, Shutlanger Road, <u>Heathencote</u>

Replacement single storey rear addition, rebuilding of external chimney stack and lining for wood burner, detached garden building, underground LPG tank, closure of the existing unmade vehicular access and formation of new vehicular access with gates.

This application had to be dealt with in three parts by Paulerspury Parish Council.

Paulerspury Parish Council had no objections with regards to the replacement single storey rear addition, rebuilding of external chimney stack and lining for woodburner however the Parish Council had great concerns and therefore strong objections to the formation of new vehicular access with gates and the detached garden building.

The road through Heathencote is a road on which vehicles travel at great speed and at the point where the new entrance was proposed vehicles were either speeding up to access the A5 or speeding up having slowed down to turn off the A5.

Paulerspury Parish Council tried to obtain a 30 MPH limit on this road in order to offer some protection to the Heathencote residents but could only secure a 40 MPH. Without breaking the law this entitled vehicles to do 40mph +10% +2 miles per hour.

The Old Smithy was opposite an active farm which had large agricultural vehicles manouvering out onto the road given that at that point they have long experience of having had no clear view of fast oncoming traffic. There was also a post box almost

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immediately opposite the proposed entrance which was used by many people other than just the residents of Heathencote.

Paulerspury Parish Council was currently liaising with Northamptonshire County Council with a view to installing additional warning signs to motorists

Paulerspury Parish Council **OBJECTED** to the formation of new vehicular access with gates.

The Parish Council viewed the "Garden Building" as overly large for a garden building per se. It was not in keeping with the surrounding buildings and it would be seen from the road.

The Parish Council noted that the LHA requested details of use of the proposed garden building. Paulerspury Parish Council also was concerned that its purpose was not clearly defined in the application given its size and design.

Paulerspury Parish Council **OBJECTED** to the detached garden building.

# c) <u>S/2019/0940/FUL</u> Mr Stuart Simpson. Cuttle Mill Bank Cottage, Watling Street Paulerspury.

Two storey side and two storey rear extensions.

Paulerspury Parish Council had NO OBJECTIONS to this application

## d) 2019/0874/FUL Mr Richard Warren. The Burrow, 11B Grays Lane, Paulerspury.

Erection of shed to rear

Paulerspury Parish Council had NO OBJECTIONS to this application

## e) <u>S/2019/0952/FUL</u> Pury Hill Limited. Rickyard Barn, Pury Hill Business Park. Alderton Road Paulerspury

Additional office space at second floor level together with roof lights, minor alterations to fenestration including aluminium lantern lights to basement level, external staircase, & decorative brick detail below eaves to south and north elevations. (Retrospective)

Paulerspury Parish Council was concerned at the numerous "Retrospective" applications which emanate from this applicant who constantly appears to disregard normal planning requirements when configuring buildings within Pury Hill Business Park. This was not acceptable practice however, notwithstanding the comments, Paulerspury Parish Council had **NO OBJECTIONS** to this application.

f) S/2019/0892/LBC Mr Stephen Wilkins. Nelsy's Cotage, 49 High Street Paulerspury.

Listed building consent for the repair of the front porch including removal and replacement of timber support posts and timber frame beneath tile porch.

Retention of four hospitality marquees for a temporary period of four years

## j) **S/2019/0987/TPO** Persimmon Homes. 3 Waterside Way Bedford Road. Northampton.

Land off Towcester Vale London Road Towcester Woodland areas comprising Oak, Ash, Hawthorn, Pine, Poplar and Sycamore. (TPO-9/2001( OS Grid ref SP709 471, Heathencote to be removed to facilitate new A5 roundabout 01 required as part of the outline permission at Towcester Vale.

This ancient woodland had been in Paulerspury Parish until it was appropriated by Towcester Town Council in 2018 against the wishes of Paulerspury Parish Council. It is therefore with great regret that this proposal to cut it down is now before the Council.

It is a landmark on the horizon and to lose any woodland at all is sad and against current sentiments.

The Parish Council therefore asks that should permission be granted the felling would only take place when the road is fully funded and construction work to create the roundabout is only a few months away from commencement.

Also the Parish Council would ask that the constructors retain trees wherever feasible and that new plantings to equal the area to be removed be planted as close to the new roundabout as possible thus restoring our landmark for future generations. k) **S/2019/0538/FUL** Mr Steve and Mrs Julie Blewett 15 Lumber Lane Paulerspury

Replacement dwelling and detached garage. Change of use of agricultural land to Residential.

Revised plans reducing front projection from two storey to one storey, reduction in height of rear single storey projection and amendments to fenestration. Utility projection changed to stone (from brick) and height of boundary wall shown.

## d) To consider the ABILITY (Northants) cic proposal for transport.

ABILITY (Northants) cic - a new Community Interest Company formed to support the residents of South Northamptonshire - focuses its activities on combating the diminished transport issues which have an impact on the communities within South Northants. The aim of this Community transport business was to benefit the community by providing people with the ability to be independent in society rather than being isolated and lonely.

Users would pay a membership fee based on their requirements and then either use bus

passes or a fare based on Stagecoach equivalent figures. Users pre book journeys and a

route is then calculated to cover all requests. Any profits are reinvested back into the

enterprise to fulfil its aims. Trips offered were varied.

The Parish Council contribution would be a one-off payment of £500 to cover initial administration costs. This would entitle Paulerspury residents use of the service 1 day per week throughout the year.

The Parish Council would consider this further when it had had time to gauge residents' response.
