#### 91/07/22 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND PRESS

Comments are welcome from those attending the meeting. The total time allowed for this item is 15 minutes with a maximum of 3 minutes per speaker. Further public comment during the meeting is permissible only at the invitation of the Chairman.

One member of the public was present – County Councillor Mr William Barter

Mr Barter reported that the Planning Policy Committee when reviewing the Spatial Strategy had resolved not to look so far ahead but just up to

2041. Logically this implies fewer houses in this plan, but also a need for a successor plan for 2041 onwards at some point.

The Employment Areas – Supplementary Planning Guidance was out for consultation. Control over the numbers of large sheds was an ambition due to their lack of employment opportunities given the dynamics of West Northamptonshire's population. It was therefore desirable to add a fourth category to the existing small, medium and large enterprises categories.

Contractors had been engaged to demolish the former Co-Op site in the Sponne Shopping Centre, Towcester and replace it with a car park.

41,000 application letters regarding the A-D Band rebates had been sent out to non-direct debit payers with 17,000 responses received. The application deadline was 31 July.

The new Highways contract had been signed with the contractor Keir. More money would be available but stronger contract management and appropriate key performance indicators would be in place in order to monitor the works. A Task and Finish group had been set up to scrutinise the contract of which Mr Barter was a member.
