



D-Day 80 Years On

As 2024 will see the 80th anniversary of the D-Day Landings, Paulerspury Village Hall Committee is planning a themed 'Forties' day to mark the occasion, to be held at the Village Hall on Saturday 8 June 2024. Planning is still at an early stage but, given enough helpers, we are hoping to have an afternoon programme aimed at all the family, followed by an evening entertainment with live music and supper. We hope both will involve inventive wartime costumes. More details will be issued as planning proceeds. But in the meantime the Committee wants to invite all the various interest groups in the village to think about how they might get involved in their own way. We visualise an afternoon exhibition with each group having a table and/or display board showing material relevant to the era. So, for example, the Horticultural Society might spend time between now and the event researching and assembling a display on the wartime 'Dig for Victory' or Women's Land Army initiatives. The Good Neighbours and Craft Groups might put something together on 'Make Do and Mend', Wartime Rationing or Austerity Recipes. The schoolchildren might paint pictures or compose short stories about Children in the War. The Church Council could perhaps assemble photos or other memorabilia taking us back to those turbulent times. None of these ideas is in any way prescriptive; just intended as examples to get people talking about what their group might be able to contribute. Help us make 'D-Day 80 Years On' into a really memorable and enjoyable event for all the village.


