Paulerspury United Reformed Chapel

In July 2023 the Parish Council took ownership of the United Reformed Chapel cemetery. Prior to taking ownership much work needed to be done which was all funded by the Synod.

In order to create a new entrance a few old gravestones had to be lifted and placed against the wall which needed repointing. A path was laid down to the newer section of the cemetery.

Half of the stretch of ground being acquired was covered in brambles, weeds and dead trees and hidden amongst the tangle were three sheds. All had to be removed and grass turf laid. Shrubs and trees which were being retained were pruned as appropriate.

From now on the Parish Council will be maintaining the cemetery and facilitating interments and reservations.
