The 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the D-Day landings is almost upon us and Paulerspury's 1940s themed celebration in the Village Hall on **Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June** should be a firm date for your diary. It all kicks off with an afternoon of information and nostalgia for all age-groups which you can drop in on between 2 and 5pm. Accompanying a projected background of topical images, music and films, there will be attractive exhibition displays from village interest groups covering military and civilian life of the time, along with fun quizzes for the children.

Afternoon admission is free but we will be selling cake and cookies – many made from recipes of the period – to go with your cuppa, and barbecued food will be available outside on nearby Spinall's Field.
