St James the Great Parish Church has been a prominent feature of Paulerspury's landscape for over 800 years and the Church is now showing its age with numerous areas of the fabric requiring renovation and repair.

So far in 2025 the PCC has arranged for repairs to be carried out to damage to the stained-glass in the West window and two high level clerestory windows, levelled raised flagstones (some weighing more than a ton) in front of the altar steps and replaced the defective surface water drainage system on the south side of the Church which had been causing flooding in the crypt.

The cost of these works has been in excess of £27,000, met by charitable grants, donations and use of reserve funds. There is still much to do and in the short term the PCC is proposing to put the clock back in to working order, replace defective guttering, repair damaged pews and flooring in the central aisles and have the stained-glass windows professionally cleaned.

The Quiz on the 18<sup>th</sup> October is to be held to raise funds towards these works, so please support by purchasing tickets for what is always a friendly and fun evening with an excellent Ploughman's Supper. The Poster gives further details. Raffle prizes will be appreciated as will donations if you are not able to attend – please speak to one of the persons named on the poster.


